Chelsea is already covering a lot of ground this year by leading Trauma 101 presentations and co-facilitating Child Adult Relationship Enhancement (CARE) training for staff and volunteers. Additionally, Chelsea co-facilitates the Resource Parenting Curriculum (RPC) for local foster parents, both on All Star's campus and out in the community.

Research Update

Many new things await All Star Children's Foundation in the new year, and our first Graduate Research Assistant is one of them! Sumitra Sankarasubramanian is a New College of Florida student working toward her Master's degree in Applied Data Science. She is doing her practicum at All Star and will graduate in May of 2022. Bringing Humane Education to Campus

For the cat lovers, All Star has a great partnership with Cat Depot. Their humane educator, Ellie (who is also an All Star volunteer!) has come to campus to teach the kids about being a good caregiver for a companion animal, how to gently interact with a pet, and how everyone can help animals.
