The mission of All Star Children's Foundation (ASCF) is to build a brighter future for children in foster care through innovation, science, and compassion. ASCF is situated on a 5-acre campus that includes a pediatric mental health treatment and research center, along with 6 single-family foster homes. Foster parents and children living on the campus receive a broad range of supportive services from a multidisciplinary team of trauma-informed providers. This team additionally provides consultation, assessment, support, and intervention to families in the community with child welfare involvement. ASCF is committed to evidence-based, trauma-informed, and culturally responsive practices that embrace the whole child within the many systems within which he/she functions in order to facilitate healthy family outcomes.

The Psychologist at ASCF contributes to the quality and comprehensiveness of services our agency provides to children and families with histories of trauma. In particular, the Psychologist is responsible for overseeing the implementation of comprehensive trauma-informed assessment and consultation services at ASCF, as well as contributing to the program development and evaluation of these programmatic areas. Additionally, the Psychologist serves as the primary supervisor for ASCF's Doctoral Psychology Internship Program (which is part of the APA-accredited Centerstone Consortium) and is involved in ASCF's many community-based trauma training initiatives. Ideal candidates for this position have extensive knowledge of childhood trauma and experience in evidence-based, trauma-informed assessment and intervention practices.

A successful candidate will have the following qualifications:

- Doctorate in Psychology (Ph.D. or Psy.D.) from an APA-accredited Institution
- Successful completion of a Postdoctoral Fellowship or its equivalent
- Current Psychologist licensure or license eligibility in the state of Florida
- Advanced training and expertise in psychological evaluation and treatment of children and youth of all ages with trauma histories and presentations
- Experience navigating various service systems involved in the lives and care of children in foster care (e.g., child welfare, education, mental health, etc.)
- Experience supervising Psychology students and interns
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
- Ability to lead and work effectively within a multidisciplinary team of professionals
- Interest and experience in Program Development and Evaluation
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, Outlook, PowerPoint) and data management environments.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Perform comprehensive, trauma-informed assessments with children and youth ages 3-18 involved with the child welfare system.
- Conduct thorough records reviews and consultations to address complex issues and challenges faced by children and families with trauma histories.

- Provide caregivers and case managers with Recommendations and Care Plans for families that are feasible to address current presenting concerns and also anticipate or prevent future challenges commonly associated with child welfare populations.
- Supervise and provide trauma-informed therapeutic intervention services as needed.
- Collaborate with Chief Program Officer on program development and evaluation of assessment and consultation services.
- Oversee ASCF's Doctoral Internship Program, including serving as primary clinical supervisor of intern(s) and liaison to Centerstone Psychology Consortium.
- Participate in ASCF's trauma-informed training and education initiatives.
- Contribute to grant writing and reporting as needed.
